# Department of Mathematics

The courses of the Department of Mathematics are designed to have relevance to Local, National and Global developmental needs. The programme outcomes carry knowledge to the acquisition of general graduate skills. For Post Graduate (PG) programmes, the programme

outcomes generally are mastery of the subject knowledge, its application in relevant contexts, learning teaching skills, preparation for higher/ research studies and so on. For Under Graduate (UG) programmes, the programme outcome is to understand the course concepts, learn effective communication skills and prepare for higher studies.

#### **Department of Physics**

The curriculum for the first year UG and PG students is designed according to the program specific outcomes and the revised syllabus is also approved by the BOS. The new courses Moral Education and Health and Wellness are introduced under the value based courses. The revised syllabus for I MSc Physics is also introduced from the academic year 2022-23 with four discipline specific core courses and one discipline specific elective course out of three offered by the department.

#### **Department of Chemistry**

The Curriculum for the first year U.G and P.G Chemistry students is designed according to the program specific outcomes and the revised syllabus is also approved by the BOS. The new courses Value Education (UBVED101), General Chemistry (UBCH1001), Professional communication English for physical sciences (UBSKB103) are introduced for first year B.Sc Chemistry students from the academic year 2022-23. The revised syllabus for the students of I-M.Sc Chemistry is also introduced from the academic year 2022-23 with four discipline specific core courses and one discipline specific elective course out of three offered by the department.

#### Department of Biotechnology

#### **Innovations:**

- Curriculum is enriched by highlighting Field/Industrial visits in subjects applicable.
- Each course is framed with Course Outcomes and is mapped with Programme Specific Outcomes as per the Bloom Taxonomy.
- 100% ICT enabled curriculum delivery is being followed.

#### New topics/chapters/subjects introduced:

- Out of total 12 courses in the UG Biotechnology, 9 courses are new whereas in PG Biotechnology, 7 new courses are introduced.
- The curriculum is designed on par with standard higher education institutions. The syllabi are revised with the introduction of thrust area of industrial needs. In UG Programme, the syllabi are revised up to 75% and in PG it is up to 80%.
